



About the Airport:

Founded in 1945, Davenport Municipal Airport sits on the western edge of beautiful Davenport, Washington, and the main gate is located at 200 S. Gunning Road. At present, the airport is home to about 17 aircraft and an agricultural spraying business.

Approximately 500,000 square feet are available for light industrial and commercial hangar development. Infrastructure is in place and the airport is prepared for improvements to fit any need.

Davenport Airport is the perfect location to support and host antique airplane fly-ins, National Aerobatic training, and regional training stops for General Aviation. Additionally, a full time A&P IA mechanic is located on-site and is always ready to help with annuals, avionics, and major repairs.

Whether stopping here to fuel up, do business with local professionals, or just grabbing a bite to eat while visiting our friendly town, pilots find this airport a great place to stop.

Airport Ownership & Management:

The airport is owned by the City of Davenport and is located within Lincoln County. The day-to-day management of the airport is the responsibility of the City of Davenport. The City operates the small but comfortable FBO featuring a 24/7 fuel terminal, courtesy crew car, and private office with a flight planning area equipped with smart TVs for supplemental training and weather support along with the available training planning areas. The pilot's lounge provides a convenient place to relax and is equipped with a bathroom and shower, high-speed Wi-Fi access, a variety of snack and drink options, and a comfortable couch to rest on.



Davenport's Local Benefits:

With a population around 10,000, Lincoln County is the world's second largest wheat producing county with Davenport producing the largest share. Davenport is located in the heart of eastern Washington's wheat country and offers a variety of services including restaurants, coffee shops,

churches, city parks, RV facilities, motels, a hospital and clinic, public library, water park, and grocery stores. Promoted by an active chamber of commerce, the City hopes to draw in new businesses and new residents by continuing to provide some of the more desirable aspects in a place to live including clean air, less traffic and crowding, affordable housing and utilities, an award-winning school district, and a regulation-sized sports complex designed for all team sports. An advantage of Davenport is its close proximity to Spokane; located just 36 miles to the east. In addition, the City's easy access to nearby recreational facilities, like Lake Roosevelt and Fort Spokane, makes it an attractive tourist destination.

Runway Reconstruction Project:

Davenport Municipal Airport is reconstructing Runway 5/23. This \$4.5 million project was recently awarded to Murphy Bros/Shamrock Paving with construction slated to begin June 14, 2021. This project shifts the runway threshold 800 feet to the west while also widening the runway to 60 feet and extending it about 500 feet—to a new length of 3,260 feet. The runway will also be equipped with new lighting and a PAPI system. In addition, this project will eliminate the crosswind Runway 3/21. A new taxi lane has been added to the project to serve relocated tenants.
